
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SKETCH DIAGRAM



1 FACTS

2 NOTIFICATION:

- 3 On 02/13/12 it was brought to my attention the Redwood City Area Office had been contacted by Party
- 4 #2(Vergasov) regarding this collision. P2 requested the investigation be re-opened.

9 PARTIES:

- 11 Party #1(Biscevic): Fled the scene immediately following the collision. Officer Clawson made several
- 12 attempts to locate P1, but he was unable to contact P1. As a result, the investigation was subsequently
- 13 closed until further information was made available. I contacted P1 on 02/13/2012 via telephone from the
- 14 Redwood City CHP Area Office. P1 was identified verbally and confirmed through a DMV records check.
- 15 P1 was identified as a party in this collision by the following: P1 is the registered owner of Vehicle
- 16 #1(Subaru), P1 admitted to driving V1 at the time of the collision, and P1 was the solo occupant at the time
- 17 of the collision.
- 19 Vehicle #1(Subaru): Fled the scene prior to CHP arrival. P1 related his vehicle had minor damage around
- 20 the entire vehicle prior to the collision including dents and scratches. P1 did not believe there was any
- 21 damage to V1 as a result of this collision. On 02/16/12 I requested CHP Officer A. Morales #17991
- 22 respond to the address listed on DMV records for V1. Officer Morales related there was very minor
- 23 damage to the front of V1 including: Small scuff to the front bumper, bent license plate, and a small white
- 24 scuff mark to the right front fender. No other damage was noted or claimed.
- 26 Party #2(Vergasov): See original collision investigation. I attempted to contact P2 via telephone on
- 27 02/15/12 but there was no answer. I left a message for P2 to contact me. On 02/16/12, I contacted P2 and
- 28 spoke with him regarding the collision.

10 STATEMENTS:

11 Statements are not verbatim and are written in summary form. The statements were read back to the involved parties for verification.

- 13 Party #1(Biscevic): I contacted P1 on 02/13/2012 at approximately 1505 hours via telephone from the
- 14 Redwood City CHP Area Office where he related the following: P1 recalled the events surrounding the
- 15 collision. P1 was driving Vehicle #1(Subaru) on US-101 northbound, south of Oregon Expressway in the
- 16 #1 lane at a stated speed of 70 mph with no other vehicles traveling directly ahead of him. P1 observed
- 17 Vehicle #2(Lincoln) approach from the rear in the #2 lane at a speed greater than V1. V2 traveled directly
- 18 behind another vehicle at an extremely close distance. The driver of V2, Party #2(Vergasov), was waving
- 19 his hands and making "gestures" at the other drivers. V2 attempted to pass V1 and merge into the #1 lane,
- 20 but there was not enough room. V2 slowed and merged into the #1 lane directly behind V1. V2 was
- 21 "tailgating" V1. P2 merged V2 back into the #2 lane. V2 passed by V1 and made an abrupt lane change
- 22 approximately one-half a car length in front of V1. V2 braked suddenly for no apparent reason and almost
- 23 came to a complete stop in the #1 lane. P1 applied V1's brakes abruptly and attempted to slow V1. Due to
- 24 P2 taking away V1's space cushion of open and unobstructed roadway, P1 was unable to stop V1. V1
- 25 struck the rear of V2. V2 remained stopped in the #1 lane. P1 was not sure about P2's mental state due to
- 26 his earlier observations of aggressive driving. P1 drove V1 around V2 using the center divide. As P1
- 27 accelerated V1, P1 observed V2 accelerate also. V2 passed by V1 and crossed all lanes into the #4 lane.
- 28 P1 drove V1 directly behind V2 thinking V2 was going to stop on the University Avenue off-ramp. V2
- 29 continued to travel westbound on University Avenue from US-101. P1 positioned V1 directly behind V2 at
- 30 the red traffic light at the intersection of University Avenue and Woodland Avenue. P1 attempted to take a
- 31 picture of V2 with his cell phone. P1 continued to follow V2 westbound on University Avenue in the City of

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- 1 Palo Alto. P1 thought P2 was not going to stop so P1 made a left turn southbound from University Avenue.
- 2 P1 further related P2 never made any attempt to get P1 to stop V1 in a location to exchange information for
- the collision. When P1 was asked why he didn't stop or call emergency personnel, he related he felt P2
- was going to try to start a fight due to his observations of P2's aggressive driving. P2 had been waving his
- hands in an aggressive manner and appeared to be angry. P1 was in fear for his safety. P1 further related
- he didn't think there was any damage to his car. 6

- Party #2(Vergasov): See original collision investigation. I contacted P2 on 02/16/12 at 1510 hours and 8
- obtained his statement regarding the collision. He related the following to me: P2 was driving Vehicle
- #2(Lincoln) on US-101 northbound, south of Oregon Expressway in the #1 lane at 65 mph. There were no
- other vehicles immediately ahead of V2. P2 looked in his rear view mirror and observed Vehicle
- 12 #1(Subaru) approaching his location at a high rate of speed. V1 was making numerous lane changes
- 13 between the #2 and #3 lanes to get through traffic. When P2 looked in his rear view mirror a second time
- 14 he observed V1 traveling directly behind V2. P2 heard the sound of a horn several times. P2 stated,
- "When I make no reaction, he hit the back of me, like a touch (minor impact)." P2 continued driving V2
- 16 northbound for approximately one hundred yards while slowing V2 at approximately 60 mph. At that point,
- 17 P1 drove V1 to the left side of V2 and attempted to pass V2 by using the center divide. P2 felt an impact to
- 18 the left rear of V2. As V1 continued to pass by V2, the right front of V1 struck the left front of V2. After V1
- 19 completed its left side pass, P2 began to slow V2. P1 then slowed V1 directly ahead of V2, forcing P2 to
- 20 bring V2 to a complete stop in the #1 lane. P1 stopped V1 in the #1 lane approximately one car length
- 21 ahead of V2. P1 placed V1 in reverse. The rear of V1 struck the front of V2. P1 accelerated V1 away at a
- 22 speed in excess of 80 mph. P2 attempted to follow V1. P2 caught up to V1 in the #1 lane as they
- 23 approached University Avenue. P2 attempted to obtain the license plate number for V1. V1 merged into
- 24 the #2 lane. P2 drove V2 past V1 in the #1 lane. P2 drove V2 to the westbound University Avenue exit.
- 25 P2 was stopped at the red traffic light on westbound University Avenue at Woodland Avenue. P2 looked in
- 26 his rear view mirror. P2 observed V1 stopped directly behind V2. P2 stated, "He was close to me and I
- 27 didn't know his intentions." P2 drove V2 to the right shoulder on University Avenue west of Woodland
- 28 Avenue and stopped. P1 continued driving V1 westbound on University Avenue. P2 drove V2 home and
- 29 waited for CHP personnel.

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- 1 Witness #1(Gilmore): W1's contact information was obtained from a Golden Gate Communications log
- 2 created on the same date and approximate time of the collision. W1 was calling emergency personnel
- 3 regarding the driving observations of Vehicle #2(Lincoln). I contacted W1 on 02/13/2012 at approximately
- 4 1650 hours via telephone from the Redwood City CHP Area Office where he related the following: W1 was
- 5 traveling in the #2 lane of US-101 northbound, south of Oregon Expressway at 60 mph. W1 observed
- 6 Vehicle #2(Lincoln) pass by in the #3 lane. V2 made an abrupt lane change at a distance of approximately
- 7 one car length in front of W1, cutting W1 off. W1 applied his brakes to avoid a collision. V2 continued
- 8 northbound while driving in an aggressive manner. V2 changed from the #2 lane into the #1 lane directly
- 9 ahead of Vehicle #1(Subaru). V2 came to an abrupt stop in the #1 lane for no apparent reason. V1
- 10 immediately slowed also. W1 further related there was no reason for V2 to stop, there was nothing
- 11 blocking the lane and no traffic ahead of V2. W1 did not see V1 strike the rear of V2, however all traffic in
- 12 the #1 lane had to abruptly apply their brakes to avoid a collision with the vehicles ahead of them. W1
- 13 observed both vehicles exiting towards University Avenue. At that point, V1 was directly behind V2. The
- 14 driver of V1 appeared to be using his I-Phone to video tape or photograph V2. W1 continued north on US-
- 15 101. W1 couldn't recall all the specific details due to the time lapse from the original collision.

17 OPINIONS AND CONCLUSIONS

18 The summary, area of impact(s), and cause were based on physical evidence, vehicle damage and statements.

20 **SUMMARY**:

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- 21 Party #1(Biscevic) was driving Vehicle #1(Subaru) on US-101 northbound, south of Oregon Expressway in
- 22 the #1 lane at a stated speed of 70 mph. Party #2(Vergasov) was driving Vehicle #2(Lincoln) on US-101
- 23 northbound, south of Oregon Expressway in the #3 lane at a speed greater than V1 and was approaching
- 24 V1 from the south. P2 was making multiple lane changes in traffic, cutting off other vehicles and following
- 25 them at distances of less than one car length. P2 turned V2 from the #3 lane into the #2 lane. As V2
- 26 began to pass by V1, P2 immediately turned V2 into the #1 lane and into the direct path of V1. P2, for no
- 27 legal reason, applied V2's brakes abruptly in the #1 lane. P2 brought V2 to a complete stop within the #1
- 28 Jane. P1 applied V1's brakes abruptly. Due to P2 stopping V2 in the #1 Jane so as to "block the normal
- 29 and reasonable flow of traffic," P1 was unable to stop V1. The front of V1 struck the rear of V2. V2 was
- 30 now stopped in the #1 lane. P1 turned V1 to the left and attempted to pass V2 using the center divide on
- 31 the left side without sufficient clearance. Due to P1's unsafe passing of V2 on the left, the right side of V1

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- 1 struck the left rear side of V2. As V1 continued north in the center divide, the right side of V1 struck the left
- 2 front corner of V2. P1 drove V1 northbound. P2 drove V2 past V1 and headed toward the University
- 3 Avenue exit. P1 followed V2 on the westbound University Avenue exit. P1 did not attempt to contact P2
- 4 nor did P1 call emergency personnel after the collision. P2 traveled to his home where he later contacted
- 5 emergency personnel.

7 AREA OF IMPACT:

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- 8 A.O.I #1(V1 vs. V2) was located approximately .5 miles south of the south edge of the Oregon Expressway
- 9 over-crossing and approximately 6 feet east of the west roadway edge of US-101 northbound.
- 11 A.O.I #2(V1 vs. V2) was located approximately .5 miles south minus 50 feet of the south edge of the
- 12 Oregon Expressway over-crossing and approximately 1 foot east of the west roadway edge of US-101
- 13 northbound.
- 15 A.O.I #3(V1 vs. V2) was located approximately .5 miles south minus 65 feet of the south edge of the
- 16 Oregon Expressway over-crossing and approximately 1 foot east of the west roadway edge of US-101
- 17 northbound.

19 **CAUSE**:

- 20 Party #2(Vergasov) caused this collision by driving Vehicle #2(Lincoln) in violation of California Vehicle
- 21 Code section 22400(a) which states in part: No person shall bring a vehicle to a complete stop upon a
- 22 highway so as to impede or block the **normal** and **reasonable** movement of traffic unless the stop is
- 23 necessary for safe operation or in compliance with law. P2 slowed V2 abruptly ahead of Vehicle
- 24 #1(Subaru) for no apparent reason and interfered with the safe operation of V1.
- 26 An associated factor to this collision is Party #1(Biscevic) driving Vehicle #1(Subaru) in violation of
- 27 California Vehicle Code section 21750 which states in part: The driver of a vehicle overtaking another
- 28 vehicle proceeding in the same direction shall pass to the left at a safe distance without interfering with the
- 29 safe operation of the overtaken vehicle. P1 attempted to drive V1 around V2 without sufficient clearance.
- 30 As a result the right front of V1 struck V2.

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1 RECOMMENDATIONS:

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2 I recommend a copy of this report be forwarded to the Santa Clara County District Attorney's Office for review and Party #2(Vergasov) be prosecuted for the following: 4 22400(a)VC- Impeding/ blocking the flow of traffic. 5 20002(a)(1)VC- Misdemeanor Hit and Run. 6 7 I further recommend **Party #1(Biscevic)** be prosecuted for the following: 8 21750VC- Failure to pass on the left safely. 9 20002(a)(1)VC- Misdemeanor Hit and Run.

11 Both parties failed to stop near the scene of the collision and exchange information.
